1. Academic Status:

The campus was established with Education Faculty in 2009 AD (2065 BS), the Management Faculty was affiliated to TU in 2014AD (2070 BS),

2. Physical Condition:

The campus is physically sound. It covers 8-00-00 bighas of land. There are 5 buildings: namely Administrative Building -1 and Academic Building-4. The classrooms are sufficient enough as per the student's number. Motorcycle stand, bicycle stand, boys and girls separate toilets, drinking water shade are other physical properties of this campus. Other physical assets includes 150 sets desks and benches, Table 12 sets and chairs 10 sets, plastic chairs 40 sets, cupboard, bookshelf, cabinet, office tables. The campus owns some other physical properties such as 2 sets computer table, 2 sets bookshelves, 8 desktop, 3 laptops, 2 printer, 2 multi-projector, 2 Wi-Fi router and some others. The campus has installed CCTV within its premises for its security issues.

3. Financial Status:

The main source of the income is student's fee. Some other sources of income are the institutional grant, bank interest on fixed deposit and others. The total income for the FY 080/081 was Rs.60,02,790.05 and the expenditure was Rs.76,73,626.98. The data show the critical situation to run the campus in the days to come.

4. Social Status:

The area where this campus is situated is very sound calm and peaceful little bit away from the locality. It is located in Bansgadhi Municipality-8, Bardiya.

The municipality is mainly populated with different Janajatis and marginalized people. This area is mainly occupied by Tharu Janajati people who are economically and educationally disadvantaged ones.

The area is also occupied by socially backward, Freed-Kamaiya, Mukta Kamlahari, Dalit, Badi, Muslim and so many others who are also economically and socially disadvantaged. Since the establishment of this campus, it has been supported by the public in every aspect. More than 350 parents have donated economically, and they have been respected as the life-long member of the campus assembly. The social relation with the communities is going on better and better, and hoped the same in the future.

5. Strengths:

- As the campus is located very closed to the East-West Highway, every facility for students is easily available.
- The campus is directly linked with Hulaki Highway, as a result, it is easily accessible for students from different area as well. This means, it has great contribution for educating society.
- The campus is physically sound. There is no any lack of physical facilities.
- Experienced and qualified teachers are dedicated towards their profession. The campus environment is homely and friendly.

6. Challenges:

- The main challenge is the drop out of students due to the trend of going abroad.

1.1.About Reports

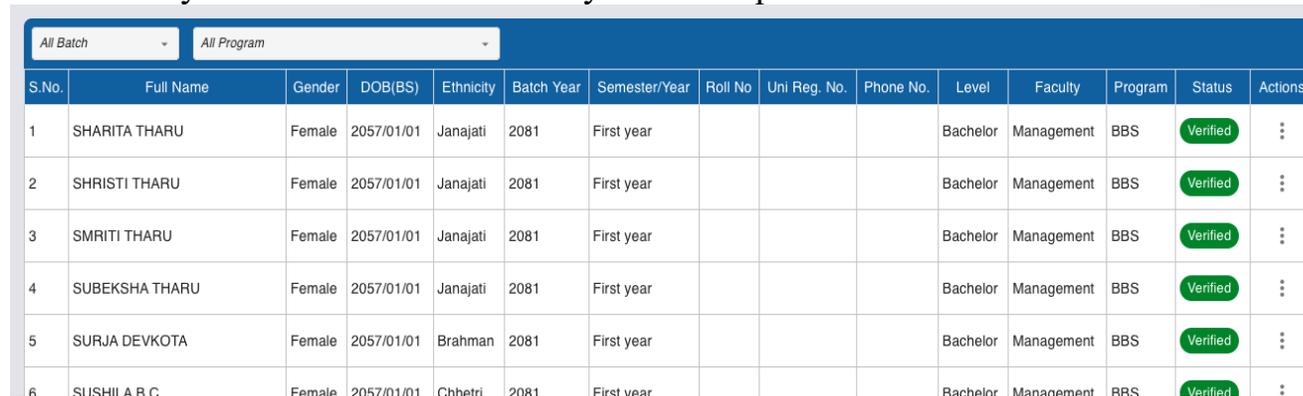
3. Student Enrolment

3.2. Total number of students by faculty, level, program, and gender

In total, Phulbari Campus serves **275 students**, with a significant female majority, reflecting the campus's inclusive approach to higher education.

Under the **Faculty of Management**, the campus runs the **Bachelor in Business Studies (BBS)** program. This program has a total enrollment of **172 students**, comprising **42 male** and **130 female** students. It aims to provide foundational and applied knowledge in business and management practices.

The **Faculty of Education** offers the **Bachelor in Education (B.Ed.)** program, which is the most populated program on campus. A total of **103 students** are enrolled, including **26 male** and **77 female** students.

- In *Bachelor in Business Studies*, there are **24 males**, **56 females**, and a **GPI of 2.33**, indicating that there are more than twice as many females as males.
- In *Bachelor in Education*, there are **37 males**, **126 females**, and a **GPI of 3.41**, indicating even higher female representation.

3.3. Total students by faculty, level, program, and ethnicity

In terms of ethnicity, Others represent the largest group with 78 students, followed by Brahman (62), Dalit (68), Others (78), Tharu (28), Chhetri (2), Madhesi (4), and Muslim (1). The data highlights a notable gender imbalance and ethnic diversity across both programs.

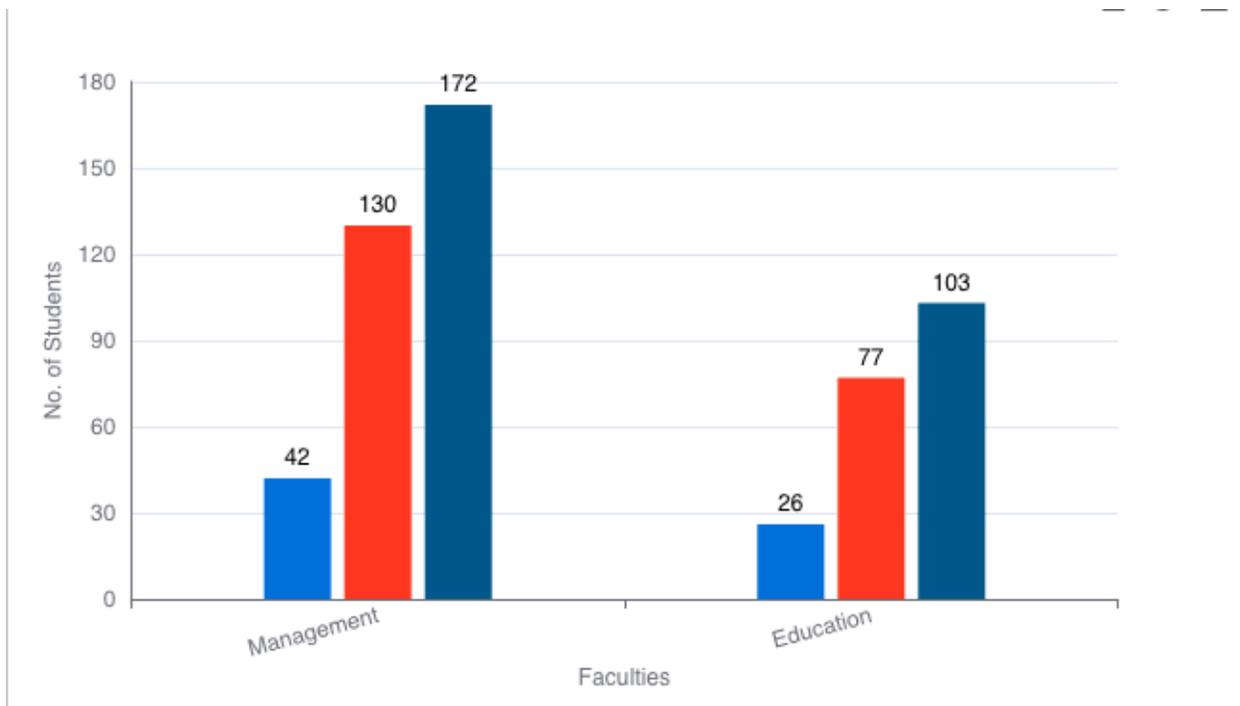

3.4. Total number of students by program and gender

A total of 243 students are enrolled across two bachelor-level programs: Business Studies under the Faculty of Management and Education under the Faculty of Education. The given table presents enrollment data for two bachelor-level programs: BBS under the Faculty of Management and Bachelor in Education under the Faculty of Education.

The above bar graph presents the male, female, and total students enrolled in two academic programs: B.Ed. and BBS. In the B.Ed. program, there are 37 male students and 126 female students altogether 163 students.

In the BBS program, the trend is similar but with smaller enrollment numbers overall. There are 25 male students and 56 female students, totaling 81 students. Again, female students outnumber male students.

3.5. Total students by program, ethnicity, and gender

Phulbari Campus has a total of **243 students** enrolled across two programs: **Bachelor in Business Studies (BBS)** and **Bachelor in Education (B.Ed.)**. Among them, **62 are male** and **182 are female**, with no students identifying as other genders.

The student body reflects a diverse ethnic composition. The largest groups are from the **Dalit (68)** and **Others (79)** categories, followed by **Brahman (62)** and **Tharu (28)**. Smaller representations include **Muslim (1)**, **Madhesi (4)**, and **Chhetri (2)**. Notably, there are no students categorized under **Janajati** in the current

3.6. Number of students by faculty and gender

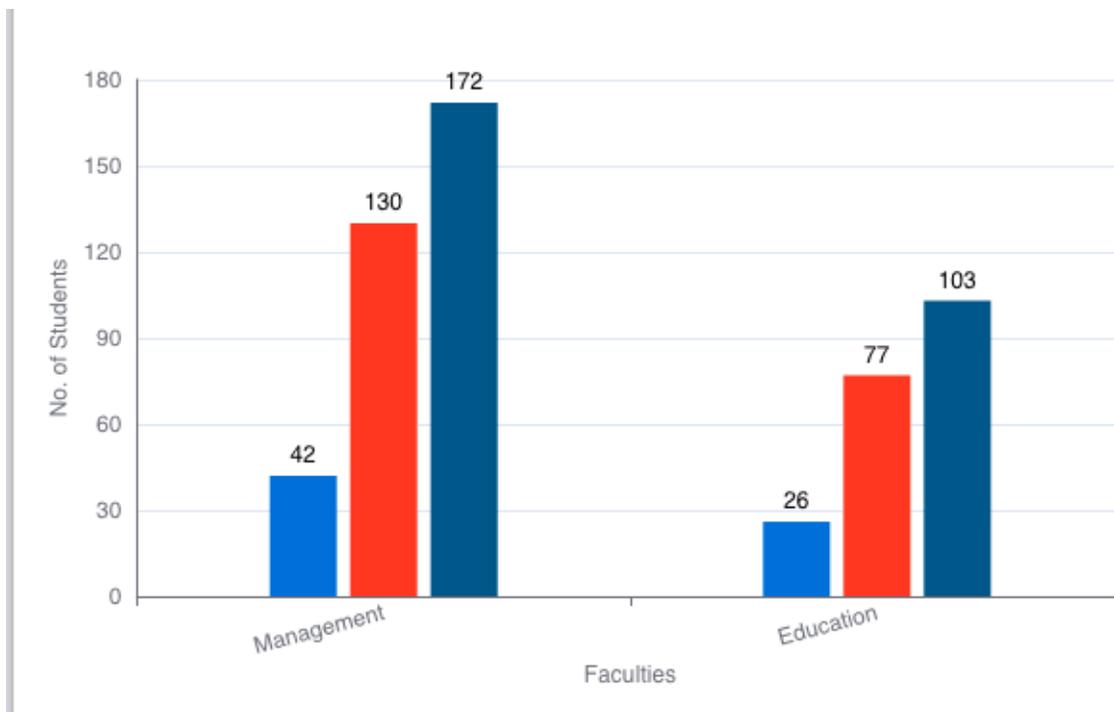


Figure 3: Total number of students by faculty

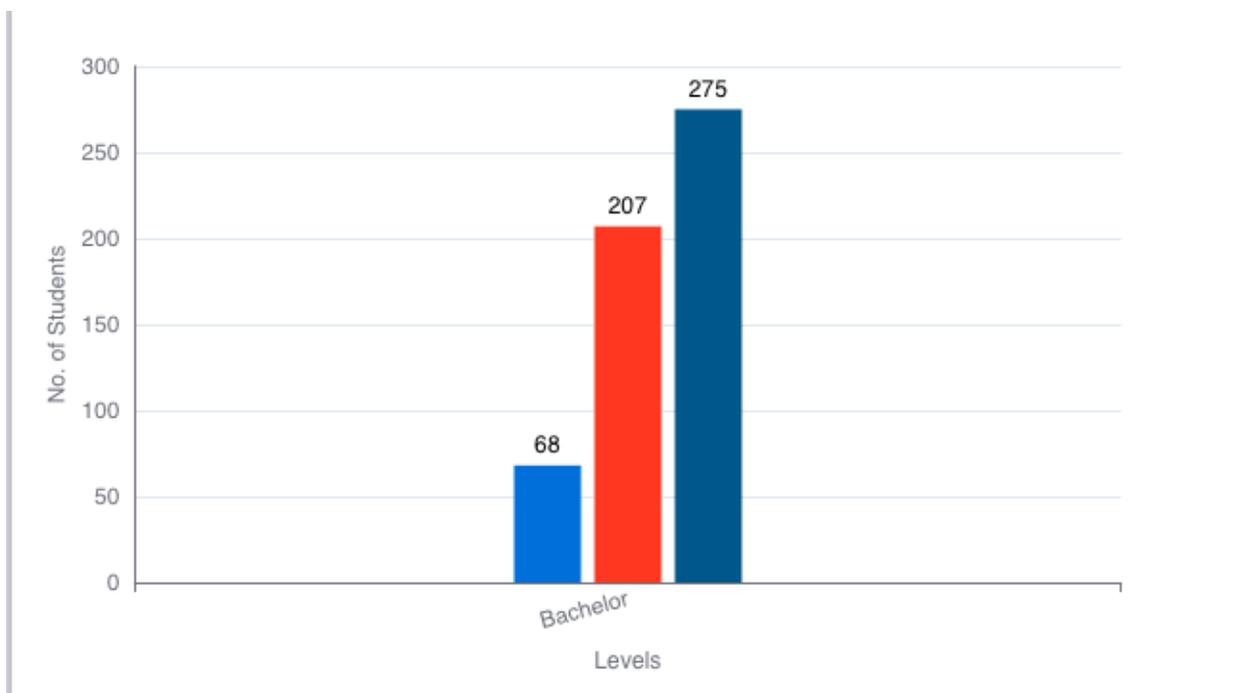


Figure 4: Total number of students by level and gender

In terms of **ethnic composition**, the largest group of students falls under the **"Tharu" category (79)**, followed by **Brahman (68)**, **Chhetri (62)**, and **Dalit (28)**. Smaller groups include **Janajati (4)**, **Others (2)**, and **Madhesi (1)**. There are **no students** recorded under the **Muslim** or **EDG (Economically Disadvantaged Groups)** categories in this dataset.

3.9. Students by province, ethnicity, and gender

The analysis of students by province, ethnicity, and gender shows a highly concentrated enrollment pattern at Phulbari Campus. All 244 students comprise 81 in the Bachelor in Business Studies and 163 in the Bachelor in Education. All the students are from **Sudurpashchim Province**, with **no representation from other provinces** such as Koshi, Madhesh, Bagmati, Gandaki, Lumbini, or Karnali.

6. Gender Parity Index

The **Gender Parity Index (GPI)** is a statistical measure used to assess the relative access and participation of males and females in a particular educational context. Typically, it is expressed as a ratio:

The Formula for GPI is as below:

$$\text{GPI} = \frac{\text{Number of females enrolled or attaining a certain level}}{\text{Number of males enrolled or attaining that same level}}$$

A GPI value close to **1.0** indicates parity between genders, whereas values below or above 1.0 suggest disparities:

GPI helps in understanding whether policies are successfully addressing gender imbalances. Data-driven insights from GPI can guide targeted interventions, such as scholarships, support programs, and outreach efforts. Educational authorities use GPI to monitor progress towards gender equality goals and to set benchmarks for improvements.

The GPI index by program, level, and faculty is shown in the table below.

Out of a total of 13 teachers, **male teachers dominate with 11 individuals**, while only **2 are female**, and there is **no representation of other gender identities**. In terms of ethnicity, **Brahmans represent the largest group with 7 teachers**, followed by **Chhetris with 3**, **Tharus with 2**, and **Others with just 1**. Most Brahman teachers are employed under contract and part-time positions, whereas Chhetris and Tharus are primarily in contract and part-time roles, with no permanent or temporary placements.

Lower ratios usually indicate smaller class sizes, allowing for more personalized instruction and Higher ratios might suggest crowded classrooms, which can impact learning quality. The standard formula of the student-teacher ratio is as below:

$$\text{Student-Teacher Ratio} = \frac{\text{Number of Students}}{\text{Number of Teachers}}$$

The student-teacher ratio is a key indicator that reflects the level of attention and support students may receive in an educational setting.

8.1. Student-Teacher Ratios on Campus

In the given data, the Faculty of Education has 8 teachers and 163 students, resulting in a ratio of approximately 20.38 students per teacher. This suggests a fairly balanced

distribution, where each teacher is responsible for around 20 students, allowing for manageable class sizes and the potential for more personalized instruction. Similarly, the Faculty of Management, with 4 teachers and 81 students, shows a slightly higher ratio of 21.25, indicating a similar level of instructional support.

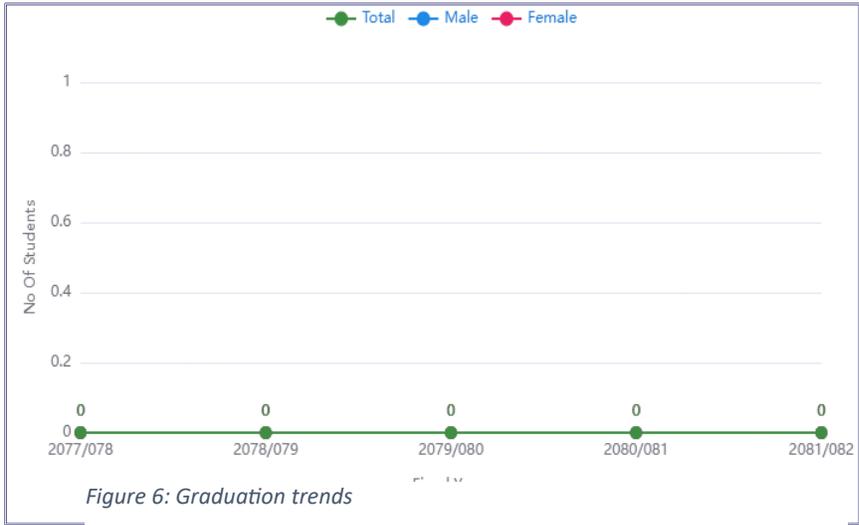
9. Student Enrollment Trends

The student enrollment trend at Phulbari Campus from fiscal year 2077/078 to 2081/082 shows a general decline followed by a slight recovery. Total student enrollment decreased from 62 in 2077/078 to a low of 39 in 2079/080, then gradually rose to 43 by 2081/082. Female student enrollment followed a similar trend, dropping from 50 to 28, then slightly increasing to 31. Male enrollment remained relatively stable, fluctuating slightly between 11 and 15 students across the years. Overall, while enrollment dipped in the middle years, the recent trend suggests a modest improvement in student numbers.

10. Enrollment by Level, Faculty, Program, Gender and caste ethnicity

Phulbari Campus currently offers bachelor-level education through two main faculties: Management and Education. A total of **244 students** are enrolled across these programs. The Management faculty runs the **Bachelor in Business Studies (BBS)** program, while the Education faculty offers the **Bachelor in Education (B.Ed)** program.

In the **Management faculty**, there are **81 students** enrolled. Among them, **25 are male** and **56 are female**. The students come from various caste and ethnic backgrounds. Notably, there are **22 Brahman, 23 Dalit, 10 Tharu, 1 Muslim, and 25 students categorized as Others**. No students from Madhesi, Janajati, or Chhetri communities are enrolled in this faculty.

The **Education faculty** has a larger enrollment, with **163 students** in total. It includes **37 male** and **126 female** students. In terms of caste and ethnicity, this program includes **40 Brahman, 45 Dalit, 18 Tharu, 4 Madhesi, 2 Chhetri, and 54 students** from the Others category. There are no Muslim or Janajati students recorded in this faculty.

Overall, the campus has a higher proportion of **female students**, with **182 females** compared to **62 males**. The enrollment data also highlights a diverse student population, with significant representation from the **Brahman, Dalit, Tharu, and Others** categories. The **Tharu** community has one of the highest numbers, especially in the Education program.

This breakdown illustrates both the gender disparity favoring female enrollment and the broad ethnic diversity present in Phulbari Campus’s student body.

Notably, female students constitute approximately 74.6% of the total enrollment, highlighting a significant gender disparity favoring female participation. This trend aligns with national data, where the Gender Parity Index (GPI) in higher education is 1.09, indicating higher female enrollment overall. The absence of students from the Mountain and Hill regions underscores the need for targeted outreach and support programs to enhance regional diversity and inclusivity in higher education.



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
